CHEF HATS CRAFT ACTIVITY

For our spring theme, we created our own "ba ba pink sheep." The students used different materials to design and color their sheep, bringing the fun of spring to life while practicing their creativity and English vocabulary.

SEASONS RELATED ACTIVITIES






We engaged 3-year-old students with seasonal themes through fun and interactive TBL (Theme-Based Learning) activitiesWe engaged 3-year-old students in seasonal themes using interactive and playful TBL (Theme-Based Learning) activities. Through hands-on learning, songs, and crafts, students explored winter, spring, and autumn concepts, expanding their vocabulary and understanding of the seasons. Activities included dressing characters for different weather, creating seasonal crafts, sorting items by season, and acting out animal adaptations to climate. The students actively participated in movement games, storytelling, and sensory exploration, which helped them connect language learning with real-life experiences. Overall, the lessons were designed to be fun, educational, and developmentally appropriate.





DRESS THE ANIMALS FOR THE SEASON!

Students were tasked with dressing animals according to the seasons. They chose outfits for each animal that matched the characteristics of the different seasons, such as warm clothes for winter, light attire for summer, and layers for fall and spring. The goal was to create fun and seasonappropriate looks for the animals.



DISCOVERING INSECTS AND THEIR HABITATS





In this activity, students learned about the habitats of different animals, starting with bees. They first explored where bees lived and then listened to the song "Ladybug Bumblebee." After that, they chose an insect from seven different sketches and created animal masks. Their teacher used hula hoops to represent different habitats, and students wore their insect masks to move toward the correct habitat. This fun and interactive activity helped students understand where different insects lived and how they fit into their ecosystems.






PUMPKIN SOUP

CREATE YOUR OWN AQUARIUM: ANIMAL HABITAT CRAFT

In this activity, participants created their own aquariums by coloring and cutting out animals to place in their custom-designed habitat. They then stuck the animals onto the aquarium scene, building an underwater world filled with vibrant creatures. The activity encouraged creativity while helping them learn about animal habitats.

HABITAT STATIONS ACTIVITY

In this activity, learners color habitat outlines and match animals to their designated habitats with their group mates. They practice learner agency by choosing their own station and role, such as coloring the habitat or animals. After finishing, they conduct a gallery walk to observe other groups' work, followed by a whole class discussion to review and reflect on the habitats and animals they saw.

PENGUIN RACE ACTIVITY

The "Penguin Race" activity involves two learners competing to wrap yarn around a wooden stick as quickly as possible, promoting hand-eye coordination and fine motor skills. The game encourages a sense of community, as the audience cheers for both participants, and the teacher reinforces that "losing" doesn't exist by celebrating everyone's efforts with a high-five.
